
COMMUNITY DESIGN LAB + MIDDLE BRANCH

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Design Immersion

Week of March 7, 2022 - Week May 16, 2022

A cohort of 10-12 high school youth will first participate in the 10-week long, hands-on Design Immersion course to explore the history, project context and technical skills and knowledge of built environment design professionals.

* Design Incubator

July 2022 - August 2022

Upon successful completion of the 10-week course, participants will spend 5-weeks this summer in the Lab's Design Incubator program. Participants will spent 20-hours per week (combo of instruction, career discovery activities, mentorship, and project work time) to incubate their own projects that center environmental justice outcomes in South Baltimore .



Nature Conservancy Project Awards: the projects you develop may also be competitive to receive additional funding (after the program) to enable further project development!

H Eligibility

Eligible participants must be current high school students, 16 years old or older living in or attending school in South Baltimore. Prior experience is not required to be a part of the program. Interested program participants should complete this application in its entirety by the application deadline.

† Compensation

Students will receive a total in \$500 for successful participation and completion of the first 10-week Design Immersion course, in addition to service learning opportunities. Those students who continue through the summer will receive another \$1500 for participation in the Design Incubator program.



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
